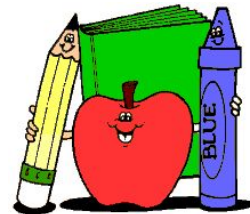

Select **one** of the projects below to demonstrate in a creative manner your understanding of **one** of the books you read. The project is to show a creation made by the student and this assignment will be **graded based on the student's creativity**. Projects will be graded based on spelling, grammar, punctuation, effort, organization, creativity, and originality. **All projects are due Monday, August 19, 2019. Please be ready to present your project on Monday, August 19, 2019 to your new class. No late projects will be accepted!**

<p>A <u>Comic Strip</u>, drawn by hand or drawn on a computer, which is at least 12 frames long and highlights important scenes. Short dialogue balloons are fine, but be sure to include an explanation of the scene at the bottom of each frame. Your projects should be in color.</p>	<p>A <u>Scrapbook</u> for one character. Include mementos of the character such as pictures, ticket stubs, lock of hair, notes from friends, awards, souvenirs, flowers, etc. All should be labeled and explained.</p>	<p>A <u>Bag of Book</u> project which uses an appropriate container (can, bag, box) you can decorate to reflect the book and put at least six items inside of it that have a connection to the book. You must explain the container, decorations, and items orally to the class and in a written report to the teacher.</p>
<p>A <u>Collage of Pictures</u> that represents and describes the characters, setting, and sequence of events of your story. You must tell the story through pictures. Your project can be up to 12 X 12.</p>	<p>Make a magazine cover page titled <u>Person of the Year</u>. Draw a picture of the main character of the story. Write a title and headings to make a cover page. Make sure the title and the headings describe the main character. Decorate the cover. The magazine cover page must be the size of a sheet of paper, 8 ½ X 11.</p>	<p>A <u>Book Cube</u> project. Use a cube-size tissue box and decorate it with pictures that describe the story. On one side, draw a picture of the characters; on the other side, draw a picture about the setting; on the third side, draw a picture about the problem of the story; and on the last side, draw a picture of the solution of the story. Write a caption under each drawing or picture.</p>

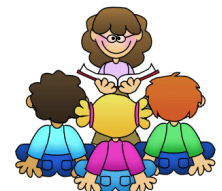
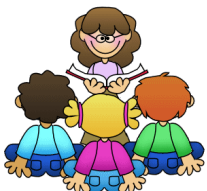
